Worship: The Call To Be

As followers of Jesus, our doing flows from our being. For the health of our souls, it is best not to reverse this order. Life will often pull you to reverse it, but the power of the Holy Spamirit, coupled with your spiritual disciplines, is essential to holding your heart in Jesus.

A simple analogy to hold, which we learned from Terry Walling, is as follows: Think of yourself as a railcar running along two tracks. Track A is called Being; this is our inner life. It is the track where God works in you, creating your inner Christ-like character. It is the place where Jesus is actively forming you. It is a contested space with many other influences that seek to begin or keep you deformed or formed to something other than Christ.

Track B is called Doing: This is where we serve using our spiritual gifts, acquired skills, knowledge, and natural abilities. This is what others see us doing (or not doing). In the track where God works through you, evident by how you serve and minister to others; the temptation is to live exclusively from this track. For a railcar to run effectively, it requires contact on both tracks to reach its desired destination. At the end of our lives, we each wish to hear Jesus say', "Well done, good and faithful servant": this is our desired destination. To run well requires both being and doing.



This season, in our partnership with Practicing the Way, we invite you into a deeper Call to Be through developing the spiritual practice of Generosity.

Should you choose to engage, what can you expect? Generosity has videos, weekly exercises and readings, and additional resources to help your LifeGroup create lifechanging daily rhythms as you apprentice under Jesus. Transformation happens in community. Running the practice of Generosity together looks like setting a time each week to gather with a LifeGroup and share a meal, watch the session video, and then discuss, reflect, and pray.

Start small. Using the <u>Generosity Companion Guide</u>, you'll practice Generosity through the weekly exercises and have a chance to dive deeper through the assigned readings and podcast episodes. The following week, you'll reflect on how it went. The goal is growth, not perfection.

STRONG (Own)

See...Your day with God's eyes, not merely your own. Thank...God for the forthcoming day: each day is a gift. Review...Your completed day with the Holy Spirit. Own...Your sin/shortcomings: Repent and Confess. Necessary...God's presence to be in your day. Invite Him. Give...Grace to yourself and others to be more like Jesus.

HEART (Others)

Honest: What known sins have I committed? Express: Where am I currently being tempted? Ask: God's grace to cover and truth to set you free. Realize: Where is God at work setting you free? Truth: Is there anywhere I have lied tonight?







Becoming Heartstrong Judges

Summary, Message, and Purpose

The book chronicles Israel's moral and spiritual descent from the relative high point at the beginning of the book through a series of downward spirals to the depths of degradation in chapters 17-21.

Though God raised up a sequence of deliverers/judges—they were unable to reverse this trend and some even became part of the problem. By the end of the book, Israel had become as pagan and defiled as the Canaanites they had displaced. If this trend continued, it would be only a matter of time before the land would vomit them out, as it had the Canaanites before them (Lev 18:28). The book of Judges is the second of the Historical Books in the Old Testament (Joshua-Esther). In the Hebrew Bible, these books are called the Former Prophets; the theological and spiritual concerns found in the Pentateuch and the Prophets take precedence over the mere records of historical facts.The Lord is both the central character and the hero of Judges.

Genre, Structure

Historical Narrative | The book falls into three parts. The prologue (1:1-3:6) deals with the failure of the second generation to press on with the conquest of Canaan. This is followed by a sixfold cycle of sin and salvation (3:7-16:31), which forms the core of the book, structured around the six major judges with six minor judges interspersed. Finally, there is an appendix (chaps. 17-21) that shows the full effects of total depravity. This structure demonstrates not only the repetition of patterns of sin and judgment but also regression.

Summary, Message, and Purpose

The book of Ruth gets its name from one of its principal characters, a Moabite woman named Ruth who was the ancestor of David and Jesus. After reading the book of Judges, which paints a dark and depressing picture of Israel, the reader is relieved to encounter Ruth. Although the book is relatively short, it is rich in examples of kindness, faith, and patience. It is one of the five scrolls that was to be read during the Jewish festivals, in particular the Festival of Weeks.

The family records of David at the end of the book show that the Lord worked through this story to provide for his people's need of a king. The book of Ruth demonstrates how the Lord shows his covenant faithfulness to his undeserving people, often in surprising ways. In the course of the narrative, each of the main characters proved to be a person of extraordinary courage and covenant love. The key word in the book is "kindness" (1:8; 2:20; 3:10).

Genre, Structure

Historical Narrative. The book of Ruth is a delightful short story with a classical plot that moves from crisis to complication to resolution. The narrator draws the reader into the minds of the characters (successively Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz), inviting us to identify with their personal anxieties and joys and in the end to celebrate the movement from emptiness and frustration to fulfillment and joy.

Historical Narrative. The first seven chapters of 1 Samuel describe Samuel's birth, call, and initial ministry among the Israelites. Chapter 8 is a major turning point as the people ask for a king to rule them "the same as all the other nations have" (1 Sam 8:5). Chapters 9-12 then describe Saul's selection-at God's direction, yet not his perfect will for the time (1 Sam 12:16-18). First Samuel 13-31 describes Saul's victories and failures.

2 Samuel 1-4 describes the struggle for Israel's throne that began with Saul's death. Second Samuel 5-24 presents highlights of David's reign, most notably God's promise to establish the throne of David's kingdom forever (2 Sam 7:1-29).

Becoming Heartstrong **182 Kings**

Summary, Message, and Purpose

The history recorded in 1 and 2 Kings covers approximately 410 years. First Kings begins around 970 BC with the death of King David, & 2 Kings ends around 60 BC with the release of King Jehoiachin from prison. During this time, the nation of Israel split into two kingdoms (930 BC), & both kingdoms went into exile (Israel in 722 BC & Judah in 586 BC).

The theological perspective of 1&2 Kings is expressed in a number of themes: (1) the sinfulness of the kings and the nation, (2) the conflict between the demands of practical politics/the demands of faith, (3) the glory that God gave to the obedient covenant kings, (4) God's harshness in judgment on some occasions and leniency on others, & (5) the conflict between the worship of the Lord and the worship of other gods.

Genre, Structure

Historical Narrative. The organizing principle of 1 and 2 Kings is not story or narrative. Kings is unique because its basic structural units are the formulaic royal records. Formal openers (1 Kgs 15:9-10) and closers (1 Kgs 15:23-24) usually identify the boundaries of these records. Then the writer could insert other types of literature before, between, and after the openers and closers: narratives, prayers, descriptions, and so on. But the most important element was the evaluation of the ruler's faithfulness to the covenant (1 Kgs 15:11-15). All these materials made up a history of covenant obedience or disobedience.

Becoming Heartstrong **182 Chronicles** Summary, Message, and Purpose

Chronicles belongs to the Writings. This classification may be partially due to the fact that Chronicles repeats information, such as the genealogies of Genesis and the histories of the kings of Judah, from the books of Samuel and Kings. Still the Chronicler uses this repeated content to support his own point, and he also adds a lot of information that we find in Chronicles alone. He limits his discussion of the various kings almost entirely to those of Judah, the southern kingdom.

Having resettled in Jerusalem after the exile, the people needed to reconnect with their identity as the people of God. Chronicles met this purpose by reminding them of their heritage and by directing them back to God's presence in their midst as symbolized by the temple. The important ideas that 1 and 2 Chronicles emphasize are (1) a direct connection to God's people in the past, (2) the continuity of the line of David on the throne of Judah, (3) the centrality of the temple and its rituals in focusing on God, (4) the importance of music in worshipping God, (5) the invincibility of God's people when they obey him, and (6) the inevitability of punishment when God's people disobey him.

Genre, Structure

Historical Narrative. The Hebrew Bible divides its books into three categories: the Law, the Prophets, and the Writings. In this arrangement, the books of Samuel and Kings are counted among the Prophets, whereas Chronicles belongs to the Writings.
