1.0 | Welcome

We desire to consistently be growing together with Jesus to make a difference in our city in raising up and sending out ministers of the Gospel. We believe it takes the entire church, to be His church for the city.

This mandate requires:

Seeing Lifecentre in unique ministry environments and as many people connected in formative discipleship during the week as on Sundays.

To fulfill this mandate, the Scriptural truths held in tension are found in 2 Corinthians 5:17-20 and Ephesians 4:11-12

First, as a follower of Jesus, one must become a minister of reconciliation. In Christ, we are all ministers. The adventure of each life is to figure out how not if, they are called as a minister.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 2 Corinthians 5:17–20 (ESV)

Secondly, there are followers of Christ who hold five-fold roles in a local church. These roles are Apostle, Prophet, Evangelist, Shepherds (Pastors) and Teacher. These roles are not only for reconciliation but are called by God, to equip followers of Jesus, to be effective in how they minister.

And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ. Ephesians 4:11–12 (ESV)

Our Process for All Credential Recommendations

The following steps are the process to receive a Ministerial Recommendation with our goal to articulate what it takes to receive a Pastoral recommendation.

Being an Ephesians 4:11-12 minister of the Gospel is a distinct calling and being ordained into the five-fold ministry must be confirmed both by the Eldership (Pastors) and the local church community.

Lifecentre takes a Mark 12:30-31 approach in initiating the process of one receiving a Ministerial Recommendation from Lifecentre.

And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these.



Heart

Before completing the application for Ministerial License with Ministers Network Canada, your life must demonstrate a recognizable call from God. This call must be evident from faithful and fruitful serving at Lifecentre. It is also affirmed by the Pastoral Leadership at Lifecentre.

Soul

You must complete Freedom Ministry at Lifecentre or an equivalent to freedom ministry process. You must be committed to living a Christ-filled life of service by embracing spiritual disciplines and engaging your spiritual gifts.

Mind

Completion of three years of Bible School (or equivalent completed ministry accreditation). You must be able to pass a robust theology assessment identifying not only the Statement of Fundamental Essentials and Truths but how to engage these beliefs (apologetics) in a lost and broken world.

Strength

You must also actively be a member at Lifecentre for consideration by serving in a leadership capacity at Lifecentre. Examples would be LifeGroup Leader, Ministry Team Leader, and Bible School Teacher. You must also display evident Christ-like character in your life and relationships by being fully engaged in an ongoing and active discipleship process both for your life, and lived out in relationships at Lifecentre.

Ministers Network Canada has four designations of being a minister with Ministers Network Canada.



2.0 | Ministerial Recommendations



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2.1 | Licensed Minister (Pastor)

Licensing is issued to a person with a recognized call of God on their life and growing in a ministry capacity. They should be functioning in some type of leadership capacity and moving toward vocational ministry. Designation of Pastor is assigned. This is a 2-4 year step where the candidate must remain in good standing in all areas.

2.2 | Ordained Minister (Reverand)

For those who have the charge of a church, are in vocational ministry (or bi-vocational), and have as their primary role the representation of the Gospel and the Christian Faith. Designation of Reverend/Pastor is assigned along with the opportunity to apply for the designation to perform marriages in the Province of Ontario and/or should be a base requirement for a position in fulltime Ministry.

3.0 | Credential Recommendation Requirements

The following criteria are established before recommendations will be considered:

A recommendation from a Lifecentre Pastor for Christian/Marketplace Minister requires:

- Completion of Bible School
- Actively serving as a leader at Lifecentre
- Before applying for Licensed Minister designation, the candidate must hold this designation, in good standing, for twelve months.

A recommendation from a Lifecentre Pastor for Licensed Minister requires:

- Completion of Bible School
- Serve 4,000 hours at Lifecentre (Two years 40 hrs full time or 4 years 20 hrs part-time)
- Complete a theology assessment
- Pass a Pastoral Panel Review
- Before applying for the Ordained Minister designation, the candidate must hold this designation, in good standing, for 2-4 years based on fruitful ministry served and observed.

A recommendation from a Lifecentre Pastor for **Ordained Minister** requires:

- Completion of Bible School
- Serve 4,000 hours at Lifecentre (Two years 40 hrs full time or 4 years 20 hrs part-time)
- Complete a theology assessment
- Pass a Pastoral Panel Review
- Functioning in a paid full-time ministry position (Recognized church or para-church ministry)
- Hold, in good standing (faithful serving, leadership, fruitful ministry assignments), Licensed Minister credential for two to four years based on fruitful ministry served and observed.
