Worship: The Call To Witness


In season eight, we will lead with our hearts. As followers of Jesus, our doing flows from our being. For the health of our souls, it is best not to reverse this order. Life will often pull you to reverse this order, but the power of the Holy Spirit, coupled with your spiritual disciplines, is essential to hold your heart in Jesus.

The call to do is about you. So, too, is the call to be. Yet, the call to witness fully involves you but is about others.

Jesus calls us to love others as we love ourselves. He challenges us to have a life-long posture of service to others. Finally, He commands us to go and make disciples of all nations. The call to witness is precisely this: it is a call, a challenge, and a command—it's not negotiable.

Now, some of you have the spiritual gift of evangelism—it is your superpower. Yet each of us, whether or not we've been given a spirit-empowered gift of sharing our faith, is called, challenged, and commanded to make disciples, which begins with sharing our faith.


During this season, invite the Holy Spirit to show you how you are wired to share Christ and assume the posture of a servant by sharing your faith with those in your sphere of influence, even strangers, who need to find Jesus. You following and helping others find Jesus is the adventure of a lifetime!



In our partnership with Practicing the Way, we invite you into a deeper Call To Witness through developing the spiritual practice of service. We are also engaging fasting together, for twenty-one days.

Fasting has four session videos, weekly exercises and readings, and additional resources to help your LifeGroup create life-changing daily rhythms as you apprentice under Jesus. Transformation happens in community. Running the practice of service together looks like setting a time each week to gather with a LifeGroup to watch the session video and then discuss, reflect, and pray.

Using the <u>Service Companion Guide</u>, you'll practice it through the weekly reach exercises and have a chance to dive deeper through the assigned readings and podcast episodes. The following week, you'll reflect on how it went. Remember: the goal is growth, not perfection.

STRONG (Own)



See...Your day with God's eyes, not merely your own.
Thank...God for the forthcoming day; each day is a gift.
Review...Your completed day with the Holy Spirit.
Own...Your sin/shortcomings; repent and confess.
Necessary...God's presence to be in your day; invite Him.
Give...Grace to yourself and others to be more like Jesus.

HEART (Others)



Honest: What known sins have I committed?

Express: Where am I currently being tempted?

Ask: God's grace to cover and truth to set you free.

Realize: Where is God at work setting you free?

Truth: Is there anywhere I have lied tonight?

Jeremiah

Summary, Message & Purpose

The book of Jeremiah holds at least two great distinctions among all the Old Testament Prophetic Books: (1) This is the longest Prophetic Book in the Bible (1,364 verses). (2) The prophet Jeremiah's life is more fully described than any of the other 15 writing prophets. Into the tumultuous times of the last half of the seventh century and the first quarter of the sixth century BC came this prophet bearing a word from God for the stubborn people of Judah. The book's contents span roughly from 640 to 580 BC.

The best known passage in Jeremiah is the new covenant text in 31:31-34. Not only is it the largest Old Testament text quoted in the New Testament (Heb 8:8-12; 10:16-17), but arguably better than any other passage, it links God's ancient promises to Eve (Gen 3:15), Abraham (Gen 12:1-3), and David (2 Sam 7:16-19) with New Testament assurances that God in Christ grants believers new hearts, salvation, and fellowship with him.

Genre & Structure

The significant dateline "the fourth year of Jehoiakim" was placed at 25:1; 36:1; and 45:1, thereby dividing the prophet's book into three main sections: the prophet's faithfulness in carrying out God's commission (chaps. 2-24), the fierce opposition to his ministry (chaps. 25-35), and the collapse of Judah (chaps. 36-45). The book of Jeremiah includes poetic sections (especially in chaps. 2-25) and prose accounts as well.



Becoming Heartstrong

Lamentations

Summary, Message & Purpose

This is a book about pain but with hope in God. The author vividly addresses the extremes of human pain and suffering as few other authors have done in history. For this reason, Lamentations is an important biblical source expressing the hard questions that arise during our times of pain.

The suffering the author discusses was brought on by the brutal overthrow of Jerusalem in 586 BC, one of the darkest times

Lamentations does not offer a complete or understandable explanation for the suffering and pain found in the writing, but it was important that the pain and suffering be connected to the actual events of 586 BC.

Genre & Structure

The book of Lamentations exhibits a remarkably fine artistic structure. Each of its five chapters (five poems) is a structurally unified text. The fact that there is an uneven number of poems allows the middle poem (chap. 3) to be the midpoint of the book. Thus, there is an ascent (or crescendo) up to a fixed climax for the entire book, thereby making chapter 3 central in its form and the message it imparts. Lamentations also uses the form of the alphabetic acrostic with the 22-letter Hebrew alphabet.



Becoming Heartstrong

Ezekiel

Summary, Message & Purpose

The book of Ezekiel contains the divinely inspired prophecies of the prophet of the same name. These prophecies consist of oracles in the first person, giving the reader a sense of access to Ezekiel's private memoirs.

Written primarily to the exiles in Babylon, the prophecies equally emphasize judgment of sins and the promise of hope and restoration.

The message of the book revolves around a pivotal event in the history of Israel— the fall of Jerusalem in 586 BC. Before the announcement of Jerusalem's fall, Ezekiel's message was characterized by judgment. In his scathing review of Israelite history, Ezekiel exposed the nation's moral depravity and absence of spiritual concern (2:1-8; 8:7-18; 13:1-23; 17:1-21; 20:1-32). After the destruction of Jerusalem was complete and the nation was in exile, his message changed. He turned to a proclamation of hope, which is what the people then needed most.

Genre & Structure

The prophet Ezekiel displayed a distinct style throughout his prophetic work. The phrase "son of man" occurs 93 times as a title for Ezekiel, focusing on the prophet's human nature. The introductory oracle phrase "the word of the LORD came to me" occurs 49 times in the book and alerts the reader to the beginning of a separate section. The phrase "I, the LORD, have spoken" also occurs frequently in Ezekiel (S:13,15,17; 17:21,24; 21:17,32; 22:14; 24:14; 26:14; 30:12; 34:24; 36:36; 37:14). Another feature for which Ezekiel is well known is his performance of symbolic, dramatic actions.
